Notes on the Text:

(The best way to evaluate and understand a novel is to personally read the book in its entirety.)

The novel does contain some adult themes and depictions of sexuality between characters. There are a few instances of explicit language and a few that depict sexuality. The scenes and language are contextually appropriate and serve to enhance the broader themes of the novel. about the various manifestations of love, loyalty, and cultural attitudes about relationships.

Connection to the Curriculum:

Love in the Time of Cholera is a challenging text that demands a full background in literary devices to understand its complexity. It is an appropriate novel for seniors as a capstone to the literature they read. demanding understanding of romanticism, modernity, and magical realism.
