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Forging the Future: Creating Career and College Opportunities Montana Advanced Opportunity Act Background Board of Trustees Meeting November 19, 2019

House Bill 387 created the Montana Advanced Opportunity Act which provides opportunities to expand "personalized learning" allowing students to accelerate their career and college readiness and reduce outof-pocket expenses for families. It also provides opportunity aid to Districts to support programs that advance pathways to careers and college.

Districts can apply for "advanced opportunity aid" for fiscal years 2021 and beyond. A high school district can apply for 20% of the district's total quality educator payment. For the Helena high school district the maximum amount is \$144,166. Sixty percent of the total or \$86,500 must be used to reduce student and family out-of-pocket costs. Forty percent of the total or \$57,666 may be used to cover program/class costs.

The 60% or \$86,500 will enable the District to assist in covering portions of student/family out-of-pocket costs for the following:

- Cover a portion of the cost of AP exams at both CHS and HHS.
- Cover a portion of CTE course fees at both CHS and HHS.
- Gas costs for travel to internships and job sites for CHS, HHS and PAL.

The 40% or \$57,666 will enable the District to cover portions of costs associated with the following program/class costs:

- Project Lead the Way Teacher memberships
- Materials and equipment for CTE classes
- Teacher training for various CTE courses
