Life lessons are taught about how to respect, love, have humility, truth, honesty, bravery and wisdom. These teachings give balance to oneself through our intellectual, emotional, physical, and spiritual experiences. Winter ceremonies and dances take place to rejuvenate the people for the spring to come and to give thanks for the things they endured throughout the year.

Now, we are approaching the spring equinox. Spring is for all things new. Everyone knows the feeling of "spring fever": we get cabin fever and want to clean everything in sight. It is the feeling of new clean things among us. It is the same for native tribes. It is the rebirth of mother earth. It is a time of balance where the sun and the moon share the same time of day and night. Mother earth is connected to everything in life.
