Dear Helena Public Schools Families,

The honks and waves were the perfect ending to a week that saw accolades for our high school students roll in fast and furious. Before sharing these exciting achievements, I want to give a couple quick reminders and announcements:

- Helena College will host its Dual Enrollment Night on May 2, from 6:30-7:30 p.m. The Montana University System's Dual Enrollment allows high school students to earn college credit for free while still in high school. In addition to cost savings, high school students get a taste of college-level academics and can complete a two- or four-year degree faster by getting prerequisites out of the way. I strongly encourage you to attend if you have an eighth-grader or a high school student.
- The deadline to apply to serve as a Student Representative to the Helena Public Schools Board of Trustees is coming up on Friday, May 6, at 4 p.m. This is an excellent opportunity to learn the working of government and administration first-hand, while representing your student body. Students who will be high school juniors or seniors for the 2022-23 school year are eligible. Please see your school principal or counselor for details.
- In last week's letter I noted the excellent work of our HPS Transportation Department,
 especially when winter weather creates hazardous road conditions. Meanwhile, the
 transportation team was recognized this month at the national level. Director Tom Cohn and his
